Remember that time when...

"I am the LORD your God, who rescued you from slavery in Egypt." Deuteronomy 5:6

Remember that you were once slaves in Egypt and that the LORD your God brought you out with amazing power and mighty deeds. That is why the LORD your God has commanded you to observe the Sabbath day. Deuteronomy 5:15

But don't be afraid of them! Just remember what the LORD your God did to Pharaoh and to all the land of Egypt. Deuteronomy 7:18

Remember that you were slaves in the land of Egypt and the LORD your God redeemed you! That is why I am giving you this command. Deuteronomy 15:15

Eat it with bread made without yeast. For seven days eat only bread made without yeast, as you did when you escaped from Egypt in such a hurry. Eat this bread – the bread of suffering – so that you will remember the day you departed from Egypt as long as you live. Deuteronomy 16:3

Remember that you were slaves in Egypt, so be careful to obey all these laws. Deuteronomy 16:12

REMEMBER WHAT THE LORD YOUR GOD DID TO MIRIAM AS YOU WERE COMING FROM EGYPT. DEUTERONOMY 24:9

"Never forget what the Amalekites did to you as you came from Egypt. Deuteronomy 25:17

Why we remember...

Jesus replied, "I assure you that everyone who sins is a slave of sin. A slave is not a permanent member of the family, but a son is part of the family forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will indeed be free. Yes, I realize that you are descendants of Abraham. And yet some of you are trying to kill me because my message does not find a place in your hearts. John 8:34-37

Thank God! Once you were slaves of sin, but now you have obeyed with all your heart the new teaching God has given you. Now you are free from sin, your old master, and you have become slaves to your new master, righteousness. Romans 6:17-18

So now there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ Jesus. For the power of the life-giving Spirit has freed you through Christ Jesus from the power of sin that leads to death. Romans 8:1-2

You were dead because of your sins and because your sinful nature was not yet cut away. Then God made you alive with Christ. He forgave all our sins. He canceled the record that contained the charges against us. He took it and destroyed it by nailing it to Christ's cross. Colossians 2:13-14

We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, on whom our faith depends from start to finish. He was willing to die a shameful death on the cross because of the joy he knew would be his afterward. Now he is seated in the place of highest honor beside God's throne in heaven. Hebrews 12:2
